All women are invited to join us on Thursday, October 13 at 1:30 p.m.!

In an effort to decrease McHenry County's above average rate of late-stage diagnosis breast cancer by increasing breast health knowledge and improving compliance with screening mammogram recommendations, women are encouraged to visit Centegra Gavers Breast Center in Crystal Lake. You will be transported, free of charge, from the Library, and upon arriving, you will be given a tour of the facility and receive a short, interactive educational session about breast health and age-appropriate screening recommendations. Women aged 40 and older who haven't had a mammogram in the past 12 months are eligible and encouraged to receive a mammogram while at the breast center. Registration by October 3 is required. Please let us know if you would like to have a mammogram while at the breast center. There is no charge for the event, however, mammograms will be billed through your insurance. Please bring a copy of your photo ID, insurance card, and your most recent mammogram if it is available. No physician's order is required to participate.

Before Little Orphan Annie was a Broadway baby and the Man of Steel a movie star, they


