



Internet Policy

The Fox River Grove Public Library District offers Internet access via Library workstations and WiFi.

Those wishing to access the Internet on Library workstations may do so by presenting a library card, state identification card, or student identification card. Residents of areas unserved by any public Library taxing district are required to pay an annual fee in order to access Library services, including Internet. See the Non-Resident Library Cards policy for details. Upon payment, non-residents' access to all Fox River Grove Memorial Library services will be equal to residents of the FRG library district.

Library workstations in the Youth Services department are available for children 13 and under and their parents and caregivers who accompany them. Parents and caregivers are responsible for monitoring their children's use of the Internet at the Library and for providing all necessary supervision. See the Youth Services Area Guidelines for details.

Internet sessions are 60 minutes long and may be extended provided no one is waiting to access a computer.

Library staff members are available to help patrons with basic issues they may encounter while using the Internet.

The Library does not monitor, nor does it control the content of the Internet and cannot be held responsible for material that may be inaccurate, offensive, of a controversial nature, or that may appear during a search.

All users of Internet workstations must respect the comfort and privacy of other Internet users at the library. Users are cautioned that information and images that are inappropriate for use in a public place are available on the Internet. Courtesy to other patrons and to library staff in this regard must be observed at all times. See our Patron Conduct policy for details.

Internet workstations may be used only for legal purposes. Illegal or prohibited acts may include but are not limited to:

- violating copyright or software licenses;

- viewing pornography;
- using personal software;
- damaging or attempting to damage library equipment, software, or software configurations;
- compromising system security;
- libel, slander, misrepresentation, solicitation, and harassment.

Illegal or prohibited use of the Internet will result in suspension of Internet privileges and may lead to loss of Library privileges. Illegal acts may be subject to prosecution by local, state, or federal authorities.

Users of wireless Internet access at the Library will observe all applicable Library Internet policies.

By signing in for Internet use, the user agrees to abide by these policies and regulations.
